

The assassination of spiritual leader and Hamas founder Sheikh Ahmed Yassin on Monday by an Israeli missile attack has ignited anger among Yemenis.

"It was murder, the worst murder in history," said Ali Hathall, who was among thousands of Yemenis out protesting against the assassination at Seventy Arena in Sana'a on Tuesday morning. "Sheikh Yassin was the best leader to free the Palestinians, and Sharon is the worst terrorist in the world.'

During thé protest on Tuesday, President Ali Abdullah Saleh addressed the demonstrators condemning the assassination. He said that the assassination of Yassin was a "clear defiance against the Muslims, not just Arabs and Palestinians.

President Saleh pointed out that "although Sheikh Yassin was murdered, there are still thousands of freedom fighters among Palestinians.'

"This act is a message to the Arab and Muslim nations and the second message from the Zionist entity is to be sent to Arafat."

"When would the Arabs wake up and

realize that this is a challenge for the Arab peoples?" Saleh wondered. He called on the Palestinian groups to

join their powers "to face this Zionist terrorism".

Saleh also slammed the recent initiatives about reforms in the region, dubbing them as "Zionist conspiracies" against Arab and Muslim nations.

"External pressures on Arabs to make political, social and economic reforms in the Middle East would not make any dif-

ference because of the fact that these reforms should come from within, the Arabs themselves not from outside", the President said.

"We do not accept any external pressures" he added.


President Saleh also called on the United Nation to impose sanctions on Israel and to "prosecute Sharon before the International Criminal Court as a war criminal and terrorist."

"He (Sharon) is the world's No. 1 terrorist. There is no terrorist like Sharon, who is killing innocent women and chil-

dren in Palestine. Israeli helicopters fired three missiles that killed Yassin and seven others as they left a mosque in Gaza City at dawn. Up to 17 were wounded, including two of Yassin's sons, and the Sheikh's wheelchair was found in a pool of blood after Continued on page 3



Vocational, Technical Training & Skill Development Fund inaugurated

On Monday 22 March 2004, in Aden, took place the celebration of the inauguration of Training Program 2004, organized by the Vocational and Technical Training and Development of Skills Fund, Aden Branch. The inauguration was attended by the Governor of Aden, Dr. Yahya Al-Shaibi, Director of Aden's Technical and Vocational Education Office, Dr. Rashad Shaya, CEO of Aden's Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Sheikh Mohamed Ba Mashmous and Director of the Fund, Mr. Abdulsallam Ibrahim.

The program aims at enhancing the abilities and skills of public and private sector workers in the governorate, which will lead to trained and qualified cadres to meet investment demand and to improve productivity in quality and quantity. Vocational and Technical Training Institutes and Centers, affiliated with the Ministry of Technical and Vocational Education and private technical institutes and centers are also participating in the training program, at a cost of 350 million Riyals. It consists of more than 70 practical and specialized programs, targeting 2000 mixed trainees from about 100 economic units affiliated with the public and private

The Governor pointed out the importance of rehabilitation and training and confirmed the readiness of the Governorate to present all facilities to institutes affiliated with the Ministry. The speeches generally confirmed the importance of activating the role of the Fund and the development of training programs so to coincide with new developments in work-related aspects for the benefits of labor force and fulfillment of need of employers.

Director of the Modern American Language Institute, Mr. Mazen

Lugman, said that the Institute trained 8000 trainees during the year 2003, having American, British and other European countries' qualifications and expertise, and that this year will witness wider cooperation to improve the skills of different trainees

Dr. Ali Mansour Bin Safa, Minister of Vocational and Technical Education, laid the foundation stone for the statefinanced vocational and training center Ahwar Province, Governorate, to be implemented during the next few months, as part of the Ministry's plans for 2004. The Minister and the Governor of Abyan and a number of officials in the Governorate paid a visit to the Central Shop, formerly known the Yemeni-Soviet projects, suspended since 1990, where the Minister issued directives regarding equipment and building after the completion of the construction of the new institute.

First 'Bank of the Poor' in Yemen

An agreement signed in Riyadh on Wednesday has allowed the setting up the Arab world's first "Bank for the Poor" in Yemen

Saudi Prince Talal bin Abd al-Aziz, the head the Arab Gulf Programme for Development Organisations (AGFUND) and Yemeni Labour and Social Affairs Minister, Abdulkarim al-Arhabi, have signed this historic accord.

The AGFUND has been committed to fund the first bank of its kind along with potential contributions from Arab coun-

This comes after Yemen had signed Yemen an agreement in October 2000 with Riyadh-based AGFUND to set up

According to the AFP, AGFUND said at the time it would provide up to \$2mn capital to the bank, with the Yemeni government putting up \$2.5mn and a further \$1mn coming from the private

"This banking system will allow the poor increasingly to become partners of the bank and shareholders," Prince Talal said, adding that Egypt, Lebanon and Jordan had agreed to set up similar

Founded in 1981 at Prince Talal's initiative, AGFUND provides grants for UN projects and coordinates aid from the oil-rich Gulf Arab states.

They represent official, party-affiliated and independent newspapers. The course consists of lectures including one by the Chief of the European Journalists Union.

Yemeni Higher Education

The report of the Higher Education and Youth Committee of the Parliament issued recently, explains that the number of universities throughout the governorates of the Republic is seven, consisting of 86 faculties and 74 academic divisions. The number of enrolled mixed students in the 2003-3004 school year is more than 230,000. The report points out there are 6366 students studying overseas for university degrees in 37 countries, including 1677 students for higher studies.

2 Million USD, a new Japanese donation

The Japanese Ambassador, Mr. Yuichi Ishii, during the Press Conference held on Wednesday 17 March, referred to the volume of Japanese assistance presented to development projects in Yemen in general and donations presented to private projects in particular.

The Ambassador confirmed that Japanese assistance are at the core of the excellent relations between the two countries and hoped that the Yemeni people would be well informed of the level of Japanese cooperation through the various media organizations.

The Ambassador signed five agreements, with a number of non-governmental organizations and local coun-

cils, within the frame of the Japanese programs to private projects, to implement five projects this year at a cost of 300 Thousand USD. 10 programs at a cost of 565 Thousand USD were implemented last year.

The Embassy of Japan will sign an agreement next week for the rehabilitation of victims of landmines at a cost of 435 Thousand USD.

The Ambassador, in reply to Yemen Times question about the US Project, the so-called "The Big Middle East", said that the US project has not been officially offered and could not be judged only on the reports of the media. Personally, before talks about the Big Middle East, the Arab-Israeli conflict should be resolved and settled, said the Ambassador.

President Saleh also said Israel has tried to foil attempts to find a peaceful solution.

'After the Arab Summit in Beirut, Sharon blockaded Arafat in Ramallah, then he killed Ahmed Yassin before the Tunis Summit," said Saleh.

Fayez Al-Jawad, Information Attache at the Embassy of the State of Palestine in Sana'a, told Yemen Times that "killing Ahmed Yassin was a bad crime. Israeli behavior, especially the killing of Ahmed Yassin, will keep things the way they are: no peace. This will kill any chances to make peace between Israel and Palestine, and it requires international intervention, especially from the United States and the European Union, to put pressure on Israel to take steps and get back on the road map to peace.'

But Hamas and other militant Palestinian groups, like Islamic Jihad and Al-Aqsa Martyr's Brigades, have threatened heavy retaliation for the assassination.

A statement from Izzedine Al-Qassam, the military wing of Hamas, said, "Whoever decided to kill Yassin decided to kill hundreds of the Zionists."

In the past, assassinations of Hamas members have led to waves of attacks on Israeli buses, restaurants and cafes, which have stalled the US-backed peace road map.

Leaders around the world have either condemned the assassination or warned that the attack would cause an escalation of violence between Israelis and Palestinians.

Britain's Foreign Secretary Jack Straw said the assassination was "unacceptable, unjustified and very unlikely to achieve its objective." The European Union's policy chief Javier Solana said, "This type of action does not contribute at all to create the conditions of peace."

The Secretary General of the Arab League, Amr Mussa, also accused Israel of trying to derail the peace process. According to his spokesman, Houssam Zaki, "With this odious operation, Israel is seeking to undermine all hope of creating conditions that would allow us to envisage a political solution to the conflict in the Middle East."

It has been reported that according to Israeli security sources, Israeli Prime Minister Ariel Sharon personally ordered and monitored the helicopter attack. In his address on Israeli radio, Sharon said that Yassin was "one of Israel's greatest enemies" and that Israel had the "natural right" to target Palestinian militants.

In the Izzedine Al-Qassam statement, Hamas blamed not only Israel for the air strike but also the United States.

"The Zionists cannot have carried out this act without the approval of the US administration, which carries the responsibility for this crime," the Izzedine Al-Qassam statement said.

According to Condoleezza Rice, the national security advisor of President Bush, the US Government was given no prior warning of the attack. But the



US Government, which along with the Israeli government considers Hamas as a terrorist organization, said that Israel has the right to defend itself against a 'terrorist'' group.

"Israel has a right to defend itself," said White House National Security Council spokesman, McCormack.

After the assassination of Yassin, Hamas leaders called on Muslims to join them. "All the Muslims of the world will be honored to join in the retaliation for this crime," said the Hamas statement.

The anger for the assassination of Yassin in Yemen carried a similar message among many who were out protesting on Tuesday.

"I am a Muslim and I want our leaders to open the door to let us carry out a jihad," cried out Yasser Raja at the protest. "It is time to get involved in the struggle in Palestine and return Al-Aqsa to us. This is a war against Islam."

Yassin, who was 67, used a wheelchair most of his life after a childhood accident that left him a quadriplegic. He founded Hamas in 1987 during the Palestinian intifada, and was held in an Israeli prison for several years before being released in 1997. Israel attempted to kill Yassin last September with an air strike, but he escaped with just a small wound to his hand.

"The assassination of Ahmed Yassin has affected the people in the Arab world dramatically," said Mazen Luqman, Director of Modern American Language Institute in Sana'a. "Sheikh Yassin was a hero. He was a man who stood up to Israel and was a man with integrity. He was straightforward and direct who never changed direction or was vague on his intentions and had a vision to liberate the Palestinians."

Hundreds of thousands of Palestinians poured into the streets of Gaza City for Yassin's funeral on Monday. It is considered the largest gathering in Gaza in recent history. Tens of thousands of Palestinians also gathered in the West Bank.

It has been reported that clashes have already erupted between Palestinians and Israelis in Gaza and Tel Aviv. On Monday night, an antitank missile was fired at Israeli troops from the Hezbollah along the border between Israel and Lebanon. Israel responded with an air strike and artillery fire.

Iraqis in Yemen waiting for safety to return

ne year after the US-led invasion began, signs are now surfacing that there is economic recovery in

Recent studies have shown that unemployment has dropped, the output of oil is expected to reach pre-war levels by the end of the year, and economic growth will increase substantially in

But the picture of Iraq that most people see doesn't show new opportunities and prosperity down the road. Bombings, rocket attacks and ambushes are what have been seen regularly, including the attacks on Shiite worshippers in Baghdad and Kerbala during their holiest day early this month, which killed over 170 Iraqis.

Many Iraqis living in Yemen show deep concern about the future of their country, and their number one apprehension is security.

"The situation in Iraq is not good," said Hassan Rashid, owner of a barbershop in Sana'a who has lived in Yemen for 10 years. "Safety, security and peace is what is needed before thinking about moving back to our country."

Thousands of Iraqis have come to Yemen for over a decade. Some came for better opportunities while the Iraqi economy suffered in the nineties, while others came to avoid oppression under the Saddam Hussein regime. It is estimated that the largest Iraqi Shiite group in the Middle East living outside of Iraq is in Yemen. But although some felt optimistic that the time to go back would come soon after the fall of the Iraqi regime, they now have doubts.

And as security continues to falter, many Iraqis in Yemen have directed their anger toward the United States.

"I am not thankful for the United

States ousting Saddam Hussein," said Dr. Erfan Al-Shammari, a cardiothoracic and vascular surgeon at Hadda Hospital. "It should have let the Iraqi people do the job. And the US government hasn't finished the job they started. Where is security? Where is rebuilding? Where is the new government? The US government said 'liberation' and 'oust the dictator.' But what are we supposed to do? Now there is violence, revenge, and so forth. Is this libera-

Some are also concerned that there might be a conflict between Shiites who take up around 60% of the Iraqi population - and Sunnis in the future.

"I am pessimistic," said Hassan Omar, an Iraqi dentist in Sana'a. "We will never have security because of the differences between the Sunnis and the Shiites.'

But most Iraqis in Yemen feel confident that the two sects can live together peacefully. Some say that Sunnis and Shiites did not generate conflicts before Saddam Hussein rose to power and that he was responsible for sectarian strife while he was leading the country.

Many also argue that relationships now can prevent a civil war based on the sectarian divide. Most of the Iraqis that talked to Yemen Times said that many of their relatives, including parents, sisters and brothers, have been married to Iraqis of the other sect.

"I am a Sunni, but two of my sisters have married Shiites," said an Iraqi engineer living in Yemen. "How can we fight between each other now that our families are mixed?"

He also believes that because the two sects are close to each other through relationships, the attacks on the Shiites in Kerbala and Baghdad early March must have come from groups outside of

"They must have come from a neighboring country," said the engineer. "They might be trying to create an Iraqis working at Lords, a barbershop in Sana'a, including the owner Hassan Rashid on the right (Yemen Times photo

internal conflict, keep the country is strong opposition. Religious clerics unstable or prevent Iraq from prospering, especially through oil.'

The Iraqis also believe that to live in harmony a democratic government is a must. They worry that a religious state would have to favor Sunnis or Shiites which could easily lead to violence. They also argue that an Iraqi government will be able to build security.

"A democratic system is our only answer," said Nawaf Kalaki, an Iraqi university student in Sana'a. "That way differences between the two sects can be handled diplomatically, not with violence. The Iraqi government would also be able to tighten security. They will do a better job than the United States because they will know much more about the people and what is going on

Early this month, an interim constitution to guarantee freedom and human rights of Iraqis was established. Even though a permanent constitution is planned to be drafted by a parliament elected at the beginning of 2005, there

argue that the constitution could lead to internal strife while analysts believe that disagreements over the constitution mainly come from competition between the three main groups in Iraq - Shiites, Sunnis and Kurds.

With danger still looming in Iraq, many Iraqis in Yemen are still waiting for safety and security before they decide to return to their country. But others are preparing to go back soon, regardless of the risk.

'My family calls me all the time and tells me that I should go back now because the economic environment keeps getting better," said Munir Al-Obeidi, an electrician.

Last year, The World Bank reported that unemployment in Iraq reached 60%. It is now estimated that unemployment has dropped to 25%.

The United States has on its agenda to implement 2,300 projects to rehabilitate Iraq's electricity, water, oil, health and transport infrastructure. The US government has already awarded a

number of contracts to companies, and it is expecting to create 50,000 jobs by

As oil production continues to rise,

the majority of the money is directed to the Iraqi Development Fund to help rebuild the war-torn country. Up to \$59 billion has been promised by the United States and other countries for rebuilding, and around \$28 billion has already been guaranteed. The World Bank estimates that Iraq's

GDP will jump 33% this year after two years of decline, and according to reports, despite widespread poverty across Iraq, consumption has boomed in the last year. Al-Obeidi and many of his friends

see this as a chance to return and are planning to go back in a few weeks.

"I don't care about the attacks," said Al-Obeidi. "I have seen wars before, so it is normal and I'm used to it. I know what it is like when life is difficult, but now that there is opportunity in my country, I'm going back, even if there is



Israel kills Yassin, drawing Hamas vows of revenge

GAZA, March 22 (Reuters) - Israel assassinated Hamas leader Sheikh Ahmed Yassin outside a Gaza mosque on Monday, striking its heaviest blow against the militant group behind dozens of suicide bombings and drawing vows of revenge.

Israeli security sources said Prime Minister Ariel Sharon personally ordered and monitored the helicopter attack against the paralysed cleric, whose wheelchair lay squashed in a pool of blood after three missiles

It was the highest-profile assassination of a Palestinian since the April 1988 killing in Tunis of Palestinian commando chief Khalil al-Wazir. At least seven other people died in the Gaza strike and two of Yassin's sons were among 15 wounded.

The attack on Yassin as he and his entourage left dawn prayers seemed to be aimed at weakening Hamas, a group seeking Israel's destruction, to prevent it from claiming victory should Sharon go ahead with a planned unilateral pullout from Gaza.

After the first missile hit, a witness told Reuters: "I looked to see where Sheikh Ahmed Yassin was. He was lying on the ground and his wheelchair was destroyed. People there darted left and right. Then another two missiles landed.'

Israeli Defence Minister Shaul Mofaz, speaking to reporters, called Yassin "the Palestinian (Osama) bin Laden" and said his hands were covered in Israeli blood.

But a dissenting voice in the Israeli cabinet, Interior Minister Avraham Poraz, said Yassin — Hamas's spiritual leader - was not "a ticking bomb" and voiced concern his death could lead to the loss of many more Israeli lives in suicide attacks.

Officials in the Palestinian Authority called Yassin a moderating force in Hamas, an Islamic movement he co-founded in 1987 with encouragement from Israel, which hoped the new group would undercut its longtime enemy, PLO chief Yasser Arafat.

"It is a clear message to the world that the Israelis are not ready to sit with the Palestinians for peace," Palestinian Prime Minister Ahmed Qurie told reporters after the killing, which he said "opened the door to

HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS AT FUNERAL

In an outpouring of grief, hundreds of thousands of Palestinians marched in a funeral procession for Yassin and the other dead. Eyes burning with tears and rage, mourners reached out to touch Yassin's Islamic flag-draped

"Sharon, start preparing your body bags because (Hamas's) Qassam Brigades will put Israeli houses in mourning and make a funeral in every Israeli street," the crowd chanted.

In the first sign of revenge within

Israel, a Palestinian with an axe hurt three people outside an army base near Tel Aviv, Israeli police said. He was

In scenes reminiscent of the start of a Palestinian uprising that began in September 2000, protests erupted in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. Mosques called an immediate general anti-Israeli protest. The army said he was a gunman who fired at the troops.

Previous assassinations of militants have triggered waves of suicide bombings that have turned Israeli buses, restaurants and cafes into charred wrecks and deepened violence that has stalled a U.S.-backed peace "road map".

Wheelchair-bound cleric was marked for death

GAZA, March 22 (Reuters) - Sheikh Ahmed Yassin spoke in a whisper from his wheelchair but the spiritual leader of Hamas led the most potent Palestinian grassroots movement against Israel before his death in an Israeli air strike on Monday.

The bearded cleric co-founded his Islamic militant group in 1987 with the goal of not just ending Israeli occupation in the Gaza Strip and West Bank but also destroying the Jewish state, reflecting the Islamist claim to all of British mandatory Palestine.

Interviewed in 2002, the 67-year-old Yassin defended his group's years of suicide attacks on Israel, telling Reuters: "The Palestinian people are forced to defend themselves.

"The Palestinian people do not have Apache helicopters or F-16s (fighterbombers) or tanks or missiles. The only thing they can have is themselves to die as martyrs," he said.

Yassin became Gaza's most charismatic and influential public figure by heading a movement that ran a broad welfare network which benefited Palestinians set adrift by the alleged corruption and incompetence of President Yasser Arafat's Palestinian Authority.

His group's appeal grew among Palestinians disillusioned with peace efforts and radicalised by harsh Israeli measures.

The air strike that killed him on Monday was not the first Israeli attempt on his life.


Yassin survived a previous assassination attempt with light wounds on September 6 last year after leaving a building where Hamas leaders were meeting seconds before an electronically guided Israeli bomb blew it apart.

"He had been marked for death for a long time...Yassin and the others were behind the terror framework in the Gaza Strip," Israeli Deputy Defence Minister Zeev Boim said on Monday.

WHEELCHAIR-BOUND SINCE YOUTH

Born in an Arab fishing village near what is now the Israeli town of Ashkelon, Yassin was in his teens when Israel was created in 1948.

A refugee, Yassin settled in Gaza after the first Arab-Israeli war in that year. He was confined to a wheelchair after being

paralysed in a sport accident as a young-

Israel arrested Yassin several times for Islamist militant activism in occupied areas.

The Hamas leader received a hero's welcome when he was freed from prison in 1997, an Israeli goodwill gesture to Jordan's King Hussein after a failed Israeli attempt to assassinate Hamas leader Khaled Mashal in Jordan.

It was four years after interim peace deals between Israel and Arafat's mainstream Fatah movement which Hamas and other Islamic radicals rejected.

Israel long accused Yassin of incitement against Israelis and of establishing Hamas's military wing.

In late 2003 Yassin signalled readiness in principle for a truce and a top aide suggested it could run for 10 years if Israel left territories occupied in the 1967 Middle East war.

But Israel dismissed the gestures as ridiculous and kept in place its designation of Yassin as "marked for death" after a decade of suicide attacks that killed hundreds of Israelis.

Last week two suicide bombers slipped out of Gaza, once thought impenetrable because of a fence surrounding it, and blew themselves up in the Israeli port of Ashdod, killing 10 people. In response, Israel launched a new offensive against militants.

The double suicide attack was claimed jointly by Hamas and Fatah's Al-Aqsa Martyrs Brigade.

Pakistani tribal elders urge gunmen to surrender

WANA, Pakistan, March 23 (Reuters) - Pakistani tribal elders tried again on Tuesday to persuade al Qaeda fighters and their tribal allies to surrender and end a bloody week-long confrontation near the Afghan border.

While fighting in Pakistan's South Waziristan eased off, attackers fired a rocket into a military camp in another remote border region, 170 km (100 miles) to the north, killing three soldiers, officials in the area said.

Hundreds of protesters took to the streets in another tribal area near the Khyber Pass to demand an end to the operation against militants. The protesters, many brandishing automatic rifles, also denounced the killing of Hamas leader Ahmed Yassin by Israeli forces.

In South Waziristan, tribal elders met representatives of the rebels for a second day on Monday and presented government demands, including the surrender of the gunmen.

"We are quite optimistic that there will be some positive development today," elder Waris Khan Afridi told Reuters before their departure.

The army says it has hundreds of militants and their Pakistani tribal allies surrounded in a pocket of rugged territory near the Afghan border.

The battle, involving 5,000 troops, is the biggest Pakistan has ever waged in its semi-autonomous tribal area and is part of a major push to sweep foreign militants from the border region and catch al Qaeda chief Osama bin Laden.

HUNT FOR AL OAEDA


The fighting in the fiercely independent region of South Waziristan erupted on Tuesday last week when security forces moved in to hunt al Qaeda suspects and their tribal allies.

Scores of people have been killed, including 12 soldiers in an ambush on an army convoy bringing up supplies on Monday.

Residents in Wana, the town nearest

to the battle, said they had heard only sporadic shelling on Monday night and all was quiet on Tuesday.

But three soldiers were killed and

four wounded when attackers hit their camp with a rocket in a pre-dawn raid in the Kurram tribal agency, to the north of Wana

There have been several attacks on army posts in the lawless border region since government forces launched the operation.

At least 13 civilians have been killed and anger over the offensive is simmering. Conservative Islamic clerics have denounced it and there have been protests in nearby towns.

On Tuesday a delegation from a hardline Islamist group met local authorities and promised to hand over any foreign militants they found in their region.

Residents say the meeting took place after tribesmen expressed concern that a military operation might take place there.

Four young victims were brought to

hospital in the town of Dera Ismail Khan, 130 km (80 miles) southeast of Wana, on Monday.

The four boys, ranging in age from five to nine, were playing in fields near their village near Wana when they came under fire.

"How long will it take? It hurts," cried eight-year-old Azam Tariq as doctors prepared to operate on his wounded legs.

Pakistani officials said last week the fierce defence the militants were putting up suggested they were protecting a "high-value target", perhaps bin Laden's deputy, Ayman al-Zawahri.

The military later dismissed that as "conjecture" and "guess work", but said an Uzbek or Chechen militant leader might be among the fighters surrounded, possibly the fanatical leader of the Islamic Movement of Uzbekistan, Tahir Yuldashev.

The Pakistani sweep of the border comes as U.S. troops in Afghanistan step up the hunt along that side of the border. The Pentagon calls the twin searches a "hammer and anvil" operation.

Suspected mercenaries appear in Zimbabwe court

HARARE, March 23 (Reuters) -Seventy suspected mercenaries made their first court appearance in Zimbabwe on Tuesday and were charged with conspiracy to overthrow the leader of Equatorial Guinea.

The suspects — mainly South Africans, Angolans and Namibians — were herded into a makeshift prison courtroom in handcuffs and leg irons and dressed in khaki jail uniforms.

Zimbabwe detained most of the group after seizing their Boeing 727. The men, including 10 whites, looked grim as they stood in silence, some of them barefoot.

They were charged under stringent public order and security laws as well as with immigration, firearms and aviation offences. They were not asked to enter a plea.

Chief prosecutor Mary Zimba-Dube said they faced life imprisonment if found guilty of the initial charge. But their lawyer Jonathan Samkange told reporters outside the court that his clients each faced maximum fines of \$200,000 on each charge.

In court Zimba-Dube accused Simon Mann from Britain of being the ring-leader and said he acted on instructions from exiled Equatorial Guinea opposition leader Severo Moto, who is based in Spain. Mann's lawyers rejected the charges.

Samkange told the court hearing at Chikurubi Maximum Prison that his clients had accused military officers of assaulting them during their arrest.

"They were assaulted, booted and some of them were actually thrown out of the plane. They were not given the opportunity to liaise with legal practitioners for a period of about four days and some were not given food during that period," Samkange said.

The men had been treated professionally once in police custody, he added.

Zimbabwe has detained the 70 since impounding their plane in Harare on March 7 during what President Robert Mugabe's government says was a mission to depose Equatorial Guinea leader Teodore Obiang Nguema Mbasogo.

The plane operator said the group was due to provide legitimate mine security in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

"The accused Simon Mann was contracted by Severo Moto...to assist him in toppling the president of Equatorial Guinea by a violent coup d'etat," Zimba-Dube said in court.

"Simon Mann...recruited 69 men with military background to carry out the task. The 70 accused persons conspired and agreed to possess dangerous weapons which were to be used in carrying out the task," she added.

Harare magistrate Mishrod Guvamombe ordered the 70 men to return to court on April 13 for a routine appearance. Samkange said the defence would on that day ask the court to remove his clients from remand.

Taiwan police chase leads in shooting, no suspect

TAIPEI, March 23 (Reuters) - Taiwan police investigated underground makers of home-made guns on Tuesday amid suspicions that a would-be assassin used such a firearm to shoot President Chen Shui-bian just hours before last week's pleating.

The shooting sparked a wave of sympathy for Chen, who won on Saturday by just 30,000 votes out of the 13 million cast after trailing in opinion polls. Opponent Lien Chan has challenged the outcome and demanded an independent inquiry into the shooting.

Police believe Chen and Vice President Annette Lu were each hit by one bullet from the same home-made firearm on Friday as they campaigned together in an open jeep.

"We have to check all the underground home-made gun factories around the country, that is one of our main targets," Hou Yu-ih, commissioner of the Criminal Investigation Bureau, told a news conference.

After cross-referencing the bullets with police data, no evidence had been found to indicate they were of a type used in any previous shootings, said Chris Chang, director of the bureau's International Criminal Affairs Division.

Investigators have interviewed more than 400 witnesses to the shooting so far but have found few leads and no suspects.

"Out of 36 pieces of information provided by the public, we have determined three valuable leads," prosecutor Wang Sen-rong told reporters in Tainan.

"These leads will help us narrow down the investigation," Chao Chongyue of the Tainan district prosecutor's office, told Reuters. "But as of now, a suspect has not emerged."

Chao declined to give details of the leads.

Chen's Democratic Progressive Party has issued photographs of the president on the operating table to dampen speculation that the shooting was staged.

On Tuesday, Chen lifted his shirt and ripped off his bandages to show his wound to top government leaders.

Chang discounted the speculation as baseless, saying no marksman was capable of shooting at a target in a vehicle moving at 30 kph (17 mph) and purposely inflict only a slight wound.

"No one could have orchestrated such a shooting," said Chang.

The presidential office said it would have been impossible to stage the attack without endangering lives. The shots gashed Chen's abdomen and notched Lu's right knee.

Thousands of demonstrators have camped out in front of the presidential office since early Sunday to demand a recount, shouting "Examine the

Chen at first thought he had been hit by a stray firecracker and his late discovery of the wound meant police were unable to narrow down the exact location of the shooting for several hours.

Afghan troops in Herat ahead of minister's funeral

KABUL, March 23 (Reuters) - The Afghan government sent more troops to the troubled western city of Herat on Tuesday to assert its authority ahead of the funeral of the provincial governor's son, who was killed in bloody clashes at the weekend.

The defence ministry began dispatching troops from the new national army to reestablish a presence in the city on Monday after the government commander was driven out after fighting on Sunday with powerful governor Ismail Khan's forces.

A defence ministry official said the government planned to station a total of 1,500 troops in Herat.

The soldiers were going "to stabilise and secure the situation" and had already been well received, Deputy Defence Minister Rahim Wardak said.

"I think that they will see them as liberators from some oppressive system which is unfortunately unfolding in that province," he told Reuters.

"It demonstrates the firm determination on the part of the central government and gives a signal to all those who are up to some sort of mischief that they better think it over," he said.

"After this the government will be decisive and the Afghan National Army is ready to be deployed anywhere."

More than 100 people, including civil-

More than 100 people, including civilians, were reported to have been killed in the clashes, some of the worst violence between pro-government factions since Karzai was installed after U.S.-led forces ousted the Taliban in 2001.

The clashes underscore the U.S.-backed president's difficulties asserting his rule over powerful regional governors like Khan and bringing stability ahead of elections supposed to be held in June, but widely expected to be delayed.

Supporting the government

Dozens of soldiers, armed with assault rifles, machine guns and rocket-propelled grenades were seen boarding planes in Kabul on Tuesday morning. The Afgan Islamic Press News agency said 140 were seen disembarking in Herat.

The commander whose forces were accused of sparking Sunday's fighting by

killing Khan's son Mirwais Sadiq — the aviation minister in President Hamid Karzai's cabinet — said he was in neighbouring Baghdis province.

Zahir Nayebzada said all his actions had been in support of Karzai's government. "I will obey the orders of the central government," he said.

Speaking to the Pakistan-based Afghan Islamic Press, Nayebzada accused Khan's men of starting the fighting and said he still had 2.000 troops with him.

He has been at odds with Karzai in the past for failing to give up tens of millions of dollars in customs revenues from Herat, which controls the bulk of Afghanistan's trade. Last year he was stripped of his post as the province's military chief.

A funeral ceremony for Sadiq, attended by Khan and a central government delegation including the powerful defence Minster Mohammad Qasim Fahim and Interior Minister Ali Ahmad Jalali, was held on Tuesday afternoon.

The government has said it will decide its next step after Fahim and Jalali report back on the fighting.

French embassies receive Islamic threats: sources

PARIS, March 23 (Reuters) - A self-proclaimed Islamic group whose authenticity is in doubt has sent letters containing threats to several French embassies in African and Muslim countries, French judicial sources said on Tuesday.

The sources said the letters were posted in Paris and bore the name of a group calling itself the Movsar Barayev Commando, but gave few details of their content.

The same group sent a letter to the government and two newspapers threatening France last week, but its authenticity has since been questioned by the government.

The Foreign Ministry had no immediate comment. The judicial sources did not say which embassies had received the threats.

Authorities initially took the first threat to "sow terror and remorse" seriously. But Interior Minister Nicolas Sarkozy subsequently said it did not bear typical Islamic hallmarks.

The group takes its name from a Chechen commander killed in a hostage-taking operation in Moscow. The successor of his rebel unit has denied any links with the French threats.

Sarkozy has said he does not rule out the possibility that the threats are the work of a French far-right group trying to sow panic and confuse the authorities.

Russian admiral causes flap over nuclear ship risk

MOSCOW, March 23 (Reuters) -The head of the Russian navy rang alarm bells on Tuesday after being quoted saying one of the world's most powerful nuclear warships might be about to blow up.

But Admiral Vladimir Kuroyedov then denied making the comment and said he meant only that the Peter the Great, the pride of Moscow's Northern Fleet, was being poorly maintained.

Russian military analysts said the incident may have had less to do with an imminent danger than with rivalries among the top brass of a navy struggling to stay afloat on a budget that has been dramatically cut since its Cold War heyday.

Two major news agencies, Itar-Tass and Interfax, quoted Kuroyedov as saying he had ordered the nuclear-powered cruiser back to port and warning that "it may blow up any minute".

But some hours later, the admiral said he had been misquoted and the agencies' reports were "not true in any

"The ship's nuclear safety system is fully tested and meets all vital requirements," he told Tass in his later remarks.

"However, the state of the living quarters and the general state of the ship is unsatisfactory and fails to meet requirements set down by regulations."

He had given the crew two weeks to fix the problems. It was not clear where the ship was. Its home port is near Murmansk on Russia's Arctic coast, close to borders with Norway and Finland.

The 19,000-ton Kirov-class vessel has 20 cruise missiles that can be equipped with nuclear warheads.

Designed to challenge the U.S. Navy in the Cold War and originally

named the Yuri Andropov after the former Soviet leader, the Peter the Great or Pyotr Veliky — spent years in the dockyard after the Soviet Union collapsed before being finally commissioned, despite concerns over its cost,

PUTIN EMBARRASSED

Declared the Northern Fleet's model ship last year, it plays a key role in manoeuvres in the North Atlantic and has often hosted visits by officials, including President Vladimir Putin.

Kommersant newspaper quoted The state-of-the-art submarine Kursk naval sources saying Kuroyedov's decision to recall the ship was motivated by rivalries among admirals, including Kuroyedov and the ship's master, Admiral Vladimir Kasatonov, who is a bitter critic of the navy chief.

The Northern Fleet upset Putin last month when three missile tests failed during his pre-election visit to the scene of Russia's biggest war games in

Tass quoted Perevoshchikov, technical director of the Northern Fleet's nuclear-powered vessels, as saying all vessels were fully maintained and reliable.

"The Kursk accident showed that even with such a powerful explosion on the ship, the reactor itself was undamaged," he was quoted as saying. "This is the best proof of its reliability.

Britain warns against travel to parts of Syria

LONDON, March 23 (Reuters) -Britain advised its nationals on Tuesday not to travel to parts of Syria that have seen recent violence but stressed that the new warning was not related to possible terror

About 30 people were killed in clashes between Syrian Kurds and police in northern cities earlier this month after a soccer match brawl at a stadium in Kameshli, a town of about 300,000 people near the Turkish border.

Tensions have sporadically flared up since.

"There has been recent unrest in parts of Syria. We advise against all non-essential travel to Kameshli and the north-east provinces of Syria," the Foreign Office said in a statement.

An official said the government believed there were only a few Britons in the affected region, mainly working in the oil industry.

"This is not terrorism-related," the official said.

The British government's advice for Syria as a whole — that "there is a high threat to Western, including British interests, from terrorism in Syria" - remains unchanged.

Charges against Bush on Iraq begin to mount up

WASHINGTON, March (Reuters) - Criticism of U.S. President George W. Bush's motives and decision-making in attacking Iraq last year may be acquiring critical mass with voters following criticism by former top counterterrorism official Richard Clarke.

Political consultants and analysts said Clarke's allegation that Bush ignored the al Qaeda threat before the Sept. 11 attacks and was obsessed by a desire to invade Iraq were especially damaging because they confirmed other previous revelations from policy insiders.

"Each of these revelations adds to the others so that the whole is greater than the sum of its parts and the message gets reinforced with voters," said Richard Rosecrance, a political scientist at the University of California, Los Angeles.

Before Clarke, there was former Treasury Secretary Paul O'Neill, who asserted in a book published in January that Bush began laying the


groundwork for an attack on Iraq from the moment he took office.

Then came the bombshell from former weapons inspector David Kay that the Iraqi weapons of mass destruction that Bush launched the war to find and destroy probably did

Kay on Tuesday warned that U.S. credibility at home and abroad was in grave danger and urged the Bush administration to own up to its intelligence fail-

"We are in grave danger of having destroyed our credibility internationally and domestically with regard to warning about future events," he said. "The you're wrong '

Blix added to the fire by accusing Bush and British Prime Minister Tony Blair of "exaggerating the risks they saw in order to get the political support (for the war) they would not otherwise have had."

The response from the White House, especially to Clarke, has been fierce and sometimes personal. It rejects any suggestion that Bush, running for re-election this year as a "war president", failed to take the al Oaeda threat seriously.

"The administration can huff and puff but if there are enough bricks in the structure, they can't blow the house down any said American University historian Allan Lichtman.

'Right now, you have quite a number of bricks. It's not just scaffolding any more," he said.

BAD TIMING Clarke's bombshell came at

an awkward time for Bush. His presidential re-election campaign was just picking up momentum after being on the defensive for most of this year. His attacks on his Democratic opponent, Massachusetts Sen. John Kerry, seemed to be finding the mark.

Now, he is back on the defensive

"Bush has chosen national security and his response to the terrorist attack as a cornerstone of his campaign and now comes this guy Clarke, their guy, who says that the administration was intentionally or unintentionally not paying enough attention to the terrorist threat," said Rick Davis, a Republican political consultant.

With the economy struggling, Bush's strongest asset is his claim to be a strong leader best equipped to protect the country in a "war on ter-

"If people start to doubt that claim and if the message from Clarke and O'Neill and others begins to stick, it would seriously weaken Bush on his strongest point," said Fordham University political scientist Tom DeLuca.

The administration response has usually been to try to destroy the reputations of its critics. It suggested O'Neill had illegally used classified documents and said he was motivated by sour grapes after having been forced to resign from the Cabinet. A Treasury probe has cleared him of misusing documents.

Similarly, White House aides said Clarke was bitter about having been denied a promotion and "out of the loop" in the administration. They also said he was a closet Democrat working as a proxy for Bush's presidential opponent, John Kerry.

'This administration has shown a tremendous ability to demonize its opponents. But at some point, people start to ask themselves, could all these people be pathological liars? At some point, they can't all be liars," said Democratic consultant Michael

Spain revises Madrid bomb death toll down to 190

Spain has revised the official death toll from the March 11 train bombings down to 190 from 202, the Interior Ministry and forensic investigators said on Tuesday.

"It's possible there will be a slight variation once we have matched up all the DNA (of remaining body parts), but until now the number of victims is 190," Carmen Baladia, director of Spain's Forensic Anatomical Institute told a news conference.

She said it was possible the death toll, which includes an unborn baby, could rise slightly, but it was unlikely to reach the provisional figure of 202 officials had previously been working with.

She said there was no scientific evidence pointing to the possibility that there was a suicide bomber among the

Is it really an American age that we live?

owadays we have become very accustomed to hear about the so called "American Age" especially among cultured and educated circles. This term is not in fact very new, but it has become more widespread since the last decade of the 20th. century: when the United States has become nearly the sole super power in our contemporary world.

But is it true that we are living American Age? In other words, does American modern culture have an absolute impact upon other human cultures? Or is it only a matter of political, economical and military influence? Let sociologists, intellectuals and philosophers give their answers, for I myself have no definite and decisive answer.

Nevertheless, we often hear American political leaders say "America MUST come first". But still this remains a political ambition, based on political, diplomatic and military means to be fulfilled.

The United States as one of the world superpowers, tried very hard since at least World War II to be the sole great leading power of our present age. It worked, and it is still working very hard, using the mottos and slogans of "liberty", "democracy" and "human rights" to achieve its ambitious aim, and it seems to achieve some success nowadays.

One cannot ignore the influential American role in many aspects of our present time ... One also cannot ignore the American aspiration to Americanize the whole human community if it could. Every nation, state or power aspires to be "the first"; yet this primacy should be legal and should be achieved through legal and humane means, and not through military troops, violent acts, compulsion, aggression or invasion.

Many great powers, states and empires collapsed when they began to impose, by force, their cultures and ideologies upon other nations and states. The Roman Empire, for instance, was great and powerful. It might have been a good civilized and cultured example to be followed or imitated by other nations and states of that time. When this empire attempted to Romanize other neighbouring and also far-distant communities by force,

it lost its stature as a civilized and cultured empire. It was regarded as a destructive power against humanity and human values and virtues. Its inhumane policy guided it directly to its catastrophe and its collapse. Other empires and great powers committed the same terrible and serious mistake and they faced the same or similar fatal destiny.

The so called "American Age" was a controversial issue and was widely circulated among European intellectuals and politicians in the mid of the 20th. century. It was a case of great dispute, when Europeans began to feel American influence started creeping very fast towards their societies interests and states. The British mainly suffered a lot from its threat.

Politically, there was a dread of an obvious American impact on the British independent policy. The famous British politician Mr. Bevan (1897-1961) gave his warning statement saying "We have allowed ourselves to be dragged too far behind the wheels of American diplomacy"1. Up to date we hear, from time to time, similar statements from different European politicians or intellectuals.

In one of the outstanding dramatic masterpieces of the fifties; Jimmy Porter, the central character in John Osborne's play LOOK BACK IN ANGER (1956), who was considered by critics as the mouthpiece of the playwright says "But I must say it's pretty dreary living in the American Age - unless you're an American of course. Perhaps all our children will be Americans"2. Definitely it was a warning to the mid 20th century generation in Britain to beware of this process of Americanization.

Of course it is not awful or shameful to benefit from other nation's culture and knowledge, if the goals and means are noble. On the contrary, any human community or society has the right to be nourished by the advantages of other human societies.

Undoubtedly, America has its influential impact on our present day issues, through its huge developed industry, economy, technology and also through its powerful military forces; that is why some label our present age as the "American Age" America also has its influential impact on human culture, through its great advances in different fields and branches of knowledge. American culture is not merely Macdonald Restaurants and other such American aspects of life for others to imitate.

America is also Harvard University and other great similar universities and centres of research and study.

It is also a country of outstanding philosophers, intellectuals and men of science and letters. Why don't we look at the works of these men? Why don't we look at the achievements of this country in science, technology and also humanities? Why don't we read and study the poetry of Emily Dickinson and Edgar Allan Poe, the drama of Tennessee Williams and Arthur Miller? The novels of William Faulkner and Ernest Hemingway?

An Age, as it seems to me, is identified by cultural aspects and features, not only by great industries and military capabilities. So America should not be moved by pride to neglect other ages and nations that paved the paths for its contemporary influence. On the other hand, others should not be appalled by this huge materialistic power, or to be amazed by artificial or superficial American style, but to search for the best and benefit from the advantages.

America is really a great power, yet this power should be utilized correctly and humanely for the benefit of its people and all human kind, according to the humanitarian Motts and slogans the Americans raise.

When extreme PRIDE and VANI-TY preoccupy American authoritative mentality; this by no means, will lead America to lose. It will lose - and it is really losing its credibility as a power for the good sake of human liberty, democracy and human rights. It will lose its stature as a cultured and civilized leading power, and consequently will face its catastrophe alone.

Finally I find it very smart to end this article with this wisecrack. The British literary critic, Sydney Smith, said in 1820 "who reads an American book? ... Literature the American have none ... it is all imported"3. Now at the end of the twentieth century and the beginning of a new one, don't we realize that what other nations have are mostly American export !!!.

Now, who are the real terrorists?

y all standards, the absolutely barbaric attack on Sheikh Ahmed Yassine clearly underscores the obviously criminal and demonic nature of the State of Israel, and all the clandestine and visible forces that stand behind. The most contemptuous of words escape the horrified observer to try to find the adjective of such a sadistic aggression, which has surpassed all the crimes to humanity by a "democratic" state, as Israel and its friends try to falsely project. Just think of it, a man, displaced from his native land under the nozzle of Zionist demagoguery, forced to live the life of a refugee under the most difficult of conditions, like most of his countrymen, witness to the continuous persecution of his people, it was inevitable that this pious man was to turn to God and dedicate himself to the liberation of his people, notwithstanding all the physical handicaps he was afflicted with almost full physical disability. Contrary to the menacing misrepresentation of Sheikh Ahmed Yassine, the man was never a direct promoter of excessive violence. Nor was he ever directly involved in the engineering of suicide attacks. This was further enhanced by the obvious failures of more secular political orientations that eventually produced autocratic regimes characterized by gross mismanagement of public affairs and a total disregard for the rights and dignity of their subjects. Thus, Islam in this context contained the dogmatic force of greatest appeal to the people of the area and Islamic justice was the only remedy sought after by people like Sheikh Yassine. With the long historical animosity to Islam by the proponents of Zionism, it was inevitable that the Zionist state and the International Zionist movement was to seek to engage the world in a cultural and dogmatic clash under the guise of upholding Western culture and civilization. Thus, even the helpless state of Sheikh Yassine was to be exaggerated as a horrific hostile demon. Nothing is further than the truth. It was the likes of Ariel Sharon and his sadistic craving for Palestinian and Arab blood, which manifested the inherent feature of Zionist dogma, until the "Promised Land" extends from the Euphrates to the Nile, by all means and at all costs. It was the frustration of a systematic campaign of oppression and repressive control that drove many of the victims of the Israeli irrepressible chauvinistic drives to follow the calls for "Jihad" or liberation (Jihad is simply a "fight" against oppression and injustice and not the ugly picture that is energetically being disseminated by the Zionist establishment, through its extensive control and influence in the world-wide mass media channels) and not any inherent nature of violence that is more at comfort with Zionist demagogues like Ariel Sharon. Sheikh Yassine's death has clearly revealed who are the real sponsors, proponents and nurturer's of organized terror. ntroduction: During the past one thousand years of Arabic history, the most apparent feature is the drop of the material and creative productivity level for the Arab community. The Association emphasizes its critical role leading to the activation of laws on chemical fertilizers. However, it expresses its concerns towards the freeze of the activities of the related authority concerned with registering and granting import permits and the continued sale of these fertilizers in residential areas in Sana'a city and other cities without the commitment to safety conditions required. It is also concerned about the sale of cooking gas cylinders not containing the distinctive smelling substance to detect gas leakage, which in turn prevents gas home-injury inci-

Reelecting Putin enhances position of Russia in the world

n the occasion of the latest Russian presielections, which were once won by Vladimir Putin, Yemen Times held the following interview with H.E. Alexander Zaspkin, the Ambassador of the Russia Federation in Sana'a:

O: The Russian presidential elections held on 14 March 2004 showed that the vast majority of registered voters cast their votes for Vladimir Putin. How do you explain this astonishing support for President Putin?

A: The main reason, in my opinion, is that during the first presidency of Mr. Putin, real action began to take place to resolve major problems of concern to the Russians including achieving political stability, enhancing security and improving the economic situation in order to improve the living condition of the population, in addition to the interest of President Putin in social development and strengthening the armed forces. Russia also played an effective role in the international arena, the improved the situation in Chechnya. President Putin does not hide the existing difficulties and talks about the problems facing the country with great transparency and this is what the Russia people under-

Q: Is the Russian citizen going to notice in their daily lives the directions of major reforms offered by President Putin?

A: Undoubtedly, the working agenda must be implemented. Mr. Putin said, "It is important to possess clarity about what we have to do and how to do it". The President, through special measures concerning the formation of the Government and the appointment of qualified cadres made before the elections, seeks to activate governmental authorities and to expedite the administrative reforms related to the social and economic development of the country.

With regards to the internal and external priorities for Russia in the coming period, President Putin has committed to support the development and maintenance of our democratic achievements through enhancing pluralism, civil society and freedom of the press. Important priorities of Russia in the coming period include: the modernization of government activities and authorities; fighting corruption and illegal incomes; securing the development of a stable economy for the prosperity of the Russian people; resolving social problems; enhancing the capabilities of the armed forces; and continuing to revitalize the multi-directional flexible foreign policy aimed at the development of joint partnerships and the search for solutions to outstanding international issues satisfactory to all sides.

Q: Please tell us about the developments in Chechnya.

A: The tendency to normalize the situation in Chechnya is clear. The election is another indication of that. where an unprecedented turnout was recorded, which indicates support for the existing policy in Chechnya. The next period will witness continuing efforts to resolve the number of duties related to enhancing the national chain, parliamentary elections, the formation of a Chechen government, strengthening the legal base and local authority and building an economic and social renaissance. The continuation of the fight against terrorism and terrorists will continue until the complete elimination of their criminal activities inside the country. There is no possibility of a truce within that.

Q: Could you elaborate on the mainstream of the Russian Foreign Ministry in the future. especially following of appointment of a new Foreign Minister?


A: Russia believes that resolving the most important issues of concern to the international community could not be achieved except through the collective efforts of all its members, based on a major role for the United Nations within the framework of a multi-polar world, and observing obligations to international conventions. This means the development of constructive partnership relations between Russia and a large number of countries to find joint stances. In this regard, the priorities of Russia include: enhancing strategic stability; the non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction; settlement of regional disputes, fighting terrorism and other threats and challenges.

Achieving the above goals coincides with the central national interests of Russia. The role and place of our country of the world represents a connection point between the West and the East, as a dialogue bridge Mr. Alexander Zaspkin between civilizations, cultures and religions and as a model of good cooperation between peoples and

As for as the appointment of Sergi Lavrouf as Foreign Minister, President Putin takes into consideration the experience he has gained in the United Nations and the support of the Former Minister Igor Evanov, who is now the head of the Russian National Security, to create an effective mechanism for foreign policy of the Russia Federation.

Q: How will these principles be achieved in the Middle East?

A: As I previously stated, Russia joins in the efforts to resolve the problems of the Middle East headed by the settlement of the Arab-Israeli issue, which could not be achieved except through a perfect plan "Roadmap", agreed to by the international community and in the preparation of which Russia actively participated. Thus, we will continue our strong contact with the related bodies, primarily within the fourparty mediators, to contribute to



establishing a Palestinian-Israeli dialogue to discuss the Roadmap principles, according to the obligations of both parties. We object to unilateral steps and barriers, which only complicate the efforts to restore the peace process.

The other issue is Iraq. It is known that Russia always supported a political and diplomatic settlement, including the clarification of the weapons of mass destruction issue. Unfortunately, events developed to scenario of using force. Russia supports the efforts of the Iraqi authorities towards stability, securing Iraqi lands, resolving social and economic problems and rebuilding Iraq on a democratic basis. We believe that the acceptance of the Iraqi Transitional Administration Law is the important step in the right direction, especially if we take into consideration the importance of establishing a legal base suitable for Iraq in the current conditions. We will continue the development of cooperation with Iraq based on the traditional cordial relations between Iraq and Russia.

Q: Nowadays, in discussions about the US project, "The Big Middle East", European suggesespecially by France and Germany. What is the Russian stance from this project?

A: Despite the active discussion of the ideas of the Bush and European Administrations, "The Big Middle East" has not been officially presented. It seems this is not by coincidence. Once international discussions begin on the major issues, details will be considered according to the opinions of related bodies. Therefore, talking about the big picture will be premature at this juncture. We do not even know about it geographically. Of course slogans such as "Freedom and democracy", "Human Rights", " Economic Prosperity" are very attractive to any people or any citizen, but the importance is how and by what means these goals are achieved.

The Russian side has presented a number of preliminary suggestions, which cannot be neglected, prior to expressing readiness to participate in the discussion of the American and other ideas.

But before talking about achieving stability and economic prosperity in the region, we must first settle the existing conflicts in it. Second, reforming projects in all regions of the world cannot be imposed. The countries of the

big Middle East must determine what assistance they want. The broad definition of democracy and its accomplishment relates to the

tions have been presented, characteristic and traditions of peoples. We know that Arab leaders are exerting great efforts to crystallize acceptable methods for Arab countries' reforms. This is an important matter and we must confront it responsibly.

> Q: Back to elections and the consequent changes in Russia, how will they be reflected in Yemeni-Russian relation, in your opinion?

A: As an immediate result of the visit of President Saleh to Russia in December 2002, a cordial personal relationship was established following their talks in Kremlin. Recently, practical results were obtained in political dialogue development, cooperation in the military and technical fields, in health and in education. We have to admit that the commercial and economic relations are still at a low level despite the noticeably higher interests of Russia companies. We suppose that the two Governments could take measures to correct this situation and it is expected in the coming few months that enhanced contacts among different ministries in the two countries will be established, and that contact between the Chambers of Commerce and Industry of the two countries will be improved. As far as the Embassy of the Russia Federation in Sana'a is concerned, the Embassy is ready to contribute in all useful initiatives presented by the governmental authorities, businessmen unions and concerned companies.

The newspaper's political editor says the government of Bajammal is facing a difficult test, the first since it was formed in the wake of the parliamentary elections last April and the second for the man since he had been appointed in his post in March 2001. 

Give them a fair shake!

It is known that under the Imamic to work in British steel factories as situation had to migrate south to the porters or oilers on steamers. Sheikhdoms, Sultanates and Emirates These workers used to save some time and were called Protectorates and comprehensively termed then by colonialist Britain as "South Arabia" whilst Yemenis in general called them collectively the occupied South. The British went further in their plans and tried to establish a Federal State prior to their hasty and disorganized furtive withdrawal due to the fatal attacks dealt to them by the then named "National Front"

Anyhow, upon the arrival of some northern Yemenis to the south most of those individuals worked a little and saved some money in order to purchase a citizenship in any of the 22 above-mentioned British sponsored Sheikhdoms, Sultanates and Emirates (the British applied their motto DIVIDE AND RULE effectively here, for they gave Sultans, Emirs and Sheikhs monthly salaries and gave them a state welcome whenever they paid a visit to Aden Colony). After saving enough money the

migrants approached the competent employees in those entities and obtained a passport or a travel document. Others had to purchase Indian British, Tanzanian British or, Pakistani British documents (although the British knew about that, their need for manual workforce made them overlook the whole thing). Now, that they had documents they approached British commercial ships that were in need of manual workers, at first in order to shovel coal for the ships before the advent of steamers and later most of them had

which were nurtured by the British at money and sent it back to their families. Whenever they became unable to continue work they returned to Yemen, often to die and be buried. A few of them asked for their pensions and many more due to their illiteracy did not know their rights, including the pension, and passed away without receiving a penny. In fact I have myself witnessed some such cases and advised many of them to apply for their pensions and some of them did. One of the funniest cases I was able to fathom is of a man who earned a disability pension from France and a retirement pension from Britain and returned to Yemen to till the land until his death, simply because he did not know about something called "Pension"

> Due to my involvement in translation, I have been approached by many who either would like to claim pensions, complete their formalities or file complaints to the Pension Service. I have noticed many cases, in which marriages are not recognized by the British Pension Service because the pensioner failed to mention the names of his ex-wives, whether real or imaginary, failed to give exact dates etc..

> The former British Department of Social Security, shortly referred to as "DSS" before the advent of the current Labour Government used to be more sympathetic and responded immediately to all claims served. However, some fraudulence was discovered in the British Embassy here in Sana'a in the mid 1990s, involving fraudulent applicants in association

with collaborators from inside the embassy. This negative aspect was causing harm to many bona fide pensioners.

Because of the said reaction if one did not give exact dates about one's marriage(s), birth dates etc. one's spouse is disqualified arbitrarily Thus, from meticulous study of some files I discovered that the majority were lawful applicants and that, mistakes in dates of birth stemmed from the fact that Yemen had no Death and Birth Registry at the time, so dates were merely surmised. Marriages were declared and in most cases marriage contracts were lost but it did not matter, as the basic thing in marriage according to Islam is its due declaration and proclamation. Also, most applicants did not consider such documents important.

Others might have lied about having many wives and children in order to avoid taxation deductions on their salaries. Therefore, in order to be fair to the said pensioners. I wonder why the British Pension Service does not require suspicious cases to undergo DNA testing (e.g. for the prime applicant, his spouse and any of the children) so that justice can be served and the image of the British justice remain untarnished due to arbitrary disqualification of some cases.

In the meantime I call upon the British Ambassador and the Yemeni Foreign Minister to sign the agreement pertaining to similar treatment in retirement affairs. I do not know the exact name with that the British call such an accord, but signing it will guarantee annual increases in pensions, as is the case with many other countries who have signed such agreements with the U.K.

Tiger Begins practice at cold and damp sawgrass

PONTE VEDRA BEACH, Florida (Reuters) - Tiger Woods began his preparation for the Players Championship, widely regarded as the fifth "major," in cold and damp conditions on Tuesday.

The world number one comes into the tournament on one of the lowest notes of his career having tied for 46th at the Bay Hill Invitational, his worst finish in five years.

"I had one of those weeks I just didn't play well," Woods told reporters. "I played great the first day and I just did not play well the next three days. I played sporadically on a golf course

where you can't do that." Unfortunately for Woods the venues are not getting any easier.

The Players Championship takes place on one of the toughest courses on the tour, the TPC at Sawgrass, and the Masters Tournament begins in two weeks at the Augusta National.

"You have to be precise here," Woods said. "Now with the rough being as high as it has been over the last few years, you have to drive the ball well, but coming into the greens, you have to be very precise where you're putting it.

"It's amazing when you're playing well on this golf course and hitting your irons well, it's amazing how easy it seems. The ball seems to funnel into the holes.

> "When you're playing poorly, every single shot repels, because you're missing the slope by maybe a yard or two and that's all it takes.'

While Woods' record in 2004 is quite usual for him, five top-10s in six events and one win at the WGC-Match Play Championship, he has been struggling for accuracy.

"The past year or so I haven't really played my best," Woods said. "Two years ago was a heck of a task coming back and playing through the knee stuff.

"Last year I wasn't allowed to practice as much. This year I've been practicing a heck of a lot more because I don't have to worry about it any more."

Since splitting with his long-time coach Butch Harmon just before the 2002 PGA Championship Woods has not won a major and has not come close to

repeating his form of 2000 and 2001 when he won four majors in 10 months.

"Butch and I are still friends," Woods said. "I still talk to him when he's out here, when I'm out here. As far as asking for help on my golf swing, no. But friendship-wise, Butch will always be my friend."

Muslim veil could cut cancer risk

RIYADH (Reuters) -Veiled women are protecting more than their modesty - they are also less prone to nose and throat cancers because their veils screen out viruses, a Canadian doctor was quoted Friday as saying.

Professor Kamal Malaker said women in Saudi Arabia, many of whom wear a full facecovering veil, suffered a low rate of the Epstein Barr Virus which causes nasopharyngeal cancer.

"The hijab (veil) is a protection against upper respiratory tract infection," the Saudi

Gazette quoted Malaker as saying. "In the kingdom, nasopharyngeal throat cancer ailment is very low among women as compared to men."

"It is interesting how a very



simple social custom can have a profound effect on a human's life," said Malaker, head of radiation oncology at King Abdul Aziz hospital in the conservative Muslim kingdom.
